Ceat Awards

- India's top batsman Virat Kohli has won the Ceat International Cricketer of the Year award while off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin, the fastest player from the country to pick 100 Test wickets, bagged the Indian Player of the Year award for 2013-14.
- Left-handed opener Shikhar Dhawan was named the International Player of the Year while Robin Uthappa, who was part of the triumphant Karnataka Ranji Trophy team, clinched the Domestic Cricketer of the Year honour.
- Kohli had won the best player award in 2011-12 too. India's under-19 cricketer Vijay Zol got the Young Player of the Year award while yesteryear stumper Syed Kirmani, one of the finest behind the stumps who was also part of the 1983 World Cup winning team, was honoured with the Lifetime Achievement Award. Kirmani played in 88 Tests and 49 ODIs.
- Australian Mitchell Johnson, who was instrumental in his country winning the Ashes Series in overwhelming fashion against England at home, and compatriot Glenn Maxwell received the Test Player of the Year and Popular Choice awards respectively, while Bangladesh all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan got the T20 Player of the award.

Riskiest online searches list for footballers

- Cybercriminals are most likely to use names of famous footballers like Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi to lure netizens to malicious webpages designed to infect them with malware, cyber security firm McAfee said.
- McAfee, part of Intel Security, has brought out 'Red Card Club' list showcasing the top 11 Brazil-bound football players whose web pages are considered to be risky for fans to search for online.
- Other names in include Spain's Iker Cassillas, Karim Ziani (Algeria), Karim Benzema (France), Paulinho (Brazil), Edinson Cavani (Uruguay), Fernando Torres (Spain), Eden Hazard (Belgium) and Gerard Pique (Spain).

National Sports Talent Search System

- Government has promised to facilitate development and promotion of sports, particularly rural sports, and said it will launch a National Sports Talent Search System.
- Addressing the first joint sitting of Parliament after the recent Lok Sabha polls, President Pranab Mukherjee said the new government will also formulate a National Education Policy and set up IITs and IIMs in every State. Maintaining that India is the world's oldest civilisation and today it is also a country with the

largest population of the youth, the President said government must equip and nurture the youth with the right kind of education, skill-set and opportunity to reap this demographic dividend.

Nadal's ninth title

- After all the consecutive victories and the confidently clenched fists, after the new hires and the new attitude, the 2014 French Open was just another red-clay rerun for Novak Djokovic.
- He arrived in Paris full of fresh and legitimate hope. He will depart again without the trophy, which is officially called the Coupe des Mousquetaires but which is clearly in need of a name change at this belief-beggaring stage of the tournament's history.
- In the modern era, no man has had a tighter grip on a Grand Slam event than Rafael Nadal, whose 3-6, 7-5, 6-2, 6-4 victory over Djokovic allowed him to win his ninth French Open by the age of just 28.

Seventh women's hockey World Cup title

- Olympic gold medallists The Netherlands defeated Australia 2-0 in the title showdown to clinch the women's hockey World Cup.
- This was the fourth time these two nations met in the women's World Cup final and The Netherlands has won three of them. Out of 13 women's World Cups since its inception in 1974, the Dutch have won it seven times.
- Captain Maartje Paumen, one of the four Dutch players winning her second World Cup gold, put her team ahead in the 12th minute with a penalty stroke conversion. The penalty stroke was awarded when

Ross Dross was brought down by the goalkeeper and a defender inside the circle.

IOA seeks views on Asiad

- The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) has sought the views of its members about submitting a bid for hosting the Asian Games in 2019.
- With the deadline for submitting the bid being July 1, the secretary general of the IOA, Rajeev Mehta, has written to the members, stating that there was not enough time to call a general body meeting.
- "The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports has already shown its keenness in supporting a bid from IOA to host the Games.

Viswanathan

Anand joint ninth

- Five-time world champion Viswanathan Anand got off to a sedate start with two draws and ended up joint ninth after the end of the fifth round of World Rapid Chess Championship.
- A couple of draws at the beginning against Ivan Salgado Lopez of Spain and Maxim Matlakov of Russia in the first two rounds for Anand were followed by a couple of victories coming at the expense of his new full time 'second' Sandipan Chanda and Russian Vladimir Fedoseev.
- But a draw in the fifth round with Viktor Laznicka of Czech Republic saw the Indian ace slump a little in the strongest ever rapid chess tournament of the world.

India fifth in the shooting World Cup

- National champion Sanjeev Rajput shot 1160 to take the 26th spot in the men's free rifle 3-position event, but India had the honour of finishing fifth in the medals

table, in the shooting World Cup at Maribor, Slovenia.

- Rajput shot 386 in kneeling, 394 in prone and 380 in standing, 16 points short of his national record 1176, and missed the final by 10 points.
- Gagan Narang was in awful form, finished second from last among 52 shooters with a score of 1141. It was his third lowest total in an international competition in the event.
- India was fifth out of 14 countries that won at least one medal, in an overall field of 59 countries, thanks to a gold and silver by Jitu Rai and a bronze by Ayonika Paul. China (7) and Germany (4) finished in that order with three gold medals.

Amla named South Africa test captain

- South African cricket broke new ground with the appointment of Hashim Amla as test captain, the first black cricketer to hold the post permanently in a sport long seen to be dominated by whites.
- Cricket South Africa (CSA) had identified Amla, one-day skipper AB de Villiers and Twenty20 leader Faf du Plessis as the potential successors to Graeme Smith, who retired from the international game in March.
- Having initially ruled himself out, Amla had a change of heart in recent weeks and will now lead the side to Sri Lanka for a two-match series next month.
- Amla believes it is the right time for him to take over after the loss of senior players Smith and Jacques Kallis in the past six months.

Srinivasan set to take over as chairman of ICC

- BCCI's president-in-exile N. Srinivasan is set to take over as the chairman of the International Cricket Council (ICC) at this

week's annual conference in Melbourne.

- BCCI secretary Sanjay Patel confirmed that Srinivasan was going to Melbourne. "By the month-end, India will take a leading role in the ICC."

Sourav Ganguly joined Mudgal Committee

- Sourav Ganguly, the former Indian cricket captain, joined the Mudgal Committee on IPL spot-fixing as an expert on cricketing affairs. The Mudgal committee headed by Justice (retired) Mukul Mudgal is probing IPL betting and spot fixing scandals of 2013.
- It is investigating on the 13 names submitted by it to Supreme Court in a sealed envelope in February 2014 after a preliminary inquiry. It was appointed in October 2013 by the Supreme Court to investigate the fixing allegations that took place during the IPL's 2013 season.
- The Supreme Court in its direction asked the probe committee to select a cricketer of impeccable repute and integrity to help the committee on the cricketing matters related to IPL betting and spot fixing.

Saina Nehwal won Australian Open Super Series title

- Saina Nehwal, Indian badminton ace, on 29 June 2014 won 750000 US dollar Australian Open Super Series by defeating Carolina Marin of Spain in straight-game 21-18, 21-11 in final played at Sydney.
- This is the second title win of the year for sixth-seeded, Saina Nehwal. The previous title for her was Indian Open Grandprix Gold in Delhi. On the other hand, this was first World Super Series final for World Number 11, Carolina Marin.

35th National Games to be held in Kerala

- 35th National Games dates were

announced at Thiruvananthapuram by Indian Olympic Association (IOA). The games will be held at 32 different venues across seven districts of Kerala from 31 January to 14 February 2015. The dates for the games were formally approved by Union Minister for Sports and Youth Affairs Sarbanand Sonowal on behalf of Government of India.

- The 35th National Games will be held in 36 disciplines and will see a total of 11641 participants that includes 7744 athletes. The participants will compete for a total of 365 gold and silver medals as well as 477 bronze medals. This is for the second time Kerala will be hosting the National Games. For the first time, Kerala conducted the 27th National Games in 1987.

2 Medals for Indian Archers

- Indian men's recurve archers went down fighting against Korea in the final of the World Cup Stage II at Medellin, Columbia recently.
- The Indian team of Atanu Das, Thupuvoyi Swuro and Sanjay Boro fought gallantly to go down in the tiebreak and claim the silver medal.
- The Indian mixed team of Das and Laishram Bombayla Devi won the bronze medal by beating their Mexican rivals. The Korean side began strongly winning the first two sets to go 4-0 up.

Validity of sports code

- The Delhi high court has directed all National Sports Federations (NSF) to follow the national sports code. This simply means that the Union sports ministry's guidelines on age and tenure restriction have attained legal sanctity.
- This is a shot in the arm for the ministry which suspended the Indian Amateur

Boxing Federation (IABF) and Archery Association of India (AAI) for not implementing age and tenure directives. The court's directive will certainly make all NSFs accountable and their functioning transparent.

- The sports ministry has repeatedly outlined that recognition to any NSF would rely on the current legal status of the organisation, recognition by the respective international federation, the Asian federation and the Indian Olympic Association (IOA). The IOA had also challenged the government's authority, but the latest directive from the court has come as a jolt.

Richmond Open

- Joshna Chinappa ended a career-long losing run to Australia's former world champion Rachael Grinham when she upset the top seed in straight games to win the inaugural \$10,000 Richmond Open.
- World No.21 Chinappa beat her 16th-ranked opponent 11-9, 11-5, 11-8 for the first time in six meetings to bag her ninth Women's Squash Association (WSA) tour title at the Country Club of Virginia.

Ambassador of TCS World 10K 2014

- Multiple Olympic champion Carl Lewis was confirmed as the event ambassador of the TCS World 10K 2014 recently. The event will be flagged off from Bangalore's Sree Kanteerava Stadium on May 18.
- In a career spanning from 1979 to 1996, Lewis won 10 Olympic medals including nine golds in disciplines as varied as 100m, 200m, 4X100m relay and Long jump. Besides the Olympic glory, he also won 10 World Championships medals, setting numerous records. The International Olympic Committee

honoured him with the title, the Sportsman of the Century for his unrivalled achievement as a track and field athlete.

Badminton Asian Championship

- For the first time after their reunion, doubles duo of Jwala Gutta and Ashwini Ponnappa made it to the quarterfinals of an event outside India.
- The pair stunned third seeds A Duanganong and V Kunchala 21-11, 21-18 in the pre-quarters of the Badminton Asian Championship in Gimcheon, South Korea.
- PV Sindhu and RMV Gurusaidutt joined the doubles specialists in the quarterfinals. While Sindhu defeated Eriko Hirose for the first time in her career 14-21, 21-13, 21-18, Guru registered a hard-fought victory over Wang Tzu Wei of Chinese Taipei 17-21, 21-13, 21-19.

Asian Championship

- India's teen sensation P V Sindhu and Commonwealth Games gold medallist pair of Jwala Gutta and Ashwini Ponnappa had to settle for bronze medals after losing their respective semifinals matches in the Asian Badminton Championship held at Korea.
- The 18-year-old Sindhu fought hard for one hour and 18 minutes before losing to the two-time reigning All England champion Shixian 21-15 20-22 12-21 in the women's singles competition.
- In women's doubles, Jwala and Ashwini failed to breach the defence of Luo Yu and Luo Ying, and suffered a 12-21 7-21 loss to the world number 10 Chinese pair

Historic accord on Sport for Peace

- The United Nations (U.N.) and the International Olympic Committee (IOC)

has signed a historic agreement to use the power of sports to promote peace and economic development, a move that strengthens collaboration between two of the world's major organizations.

- The U.N. and Olympic charters, both call for international cooperation to promote peace, a better life for people around the world and preserving human dignity.
- The Memorandum of Understanding signed with the IOC was "a logical and historic step after years of ever closer collaboration in using sport to promote development and peace."
- The agreement calls for joint sporting initiatives between the IOC, national Olympic committees, international sports federations, organizing committees and international athletes and the 193 U.N. member states, U.N. agencies, envoys and goodwill ambassadors.
- The two organizations will be promoting education for youth through sport without discrimination of any kind, access to sport for all communities especially the most disadvantaged and marginalized, healthy lifestyles and peace-building and community dialogue.

Indian tennis players and top-100 bracket

- A struggling Somdev Dev-varman dropped out of top-100 bracket in the singles rankings as the Indian slipped to 102 with the loss of two places.
- Somdev has been struggling since winning the Delhi Open challenger title and failed to cross the first round hurdle in five consecutive tournaments on the ATP tour.
- Also sliding in the ATP ranking ladder was India's second best singles player, Yuki Bhambri, who lost four spots to be 153.

- The tall and big serving Saketh Myneni though jumped seven places to be 262.
- In the doubles, Leander Paes continued to be India's best ranked player and the only one in top-10 at number nine. Davis Cupper Rohan Bopanna was next best at number 14.
- Mahesh Bhupathi, who will retire this year and will be playing only select events, gained a place to be 46.

Real Madrid reach their first Champions League final

- Real Madrid reached their first Champions League final for 12 years with an historic 4-0 win at Bayern Munich in semifinal, second leg to knock the holders out.
- Having won last week's first leg 1-0 in Madrid, Real won the semifinal 5-0 on aggregate as Pep Guardiola's Bayern suffered their heaviest home defeat in European competition.
- Bayern had previously never lost at home by more than two goals in Europe as the Bavarian giants saw their dreams of reaching a fourth Champions League final in five years crushed.

Top test rank for Australia

- Australia has reclaimed the number one Test ranking for the first time in five years.
- They also remain the top-rated one day international side in the latest official rankings from the International Cricket Council (ICC).
- It is the first time since December 2008 that the country has been ranked number one in Tests and ODIs at the same time. They last held the top Test ranking in August 2009, when they were displaced after losing the Ashes 2-1 to England.

Reliance ICC T20I Team Rankings

- India has become the number-one ranked Twenty20 Inter-national (T20I) side after the annual update of the Reliance ICC T20I Team Rankings, which was recently announced .
- India has swapped places with ICC World Twenty20 Bangladesh 2014 champion Sri Lanka.
- In the past 12 months, India has lost just one T20I (against Sri Lanka in the recent ICC WT20 Final in Bangladesh), while Sri Lanka has lost four matches. The 2013-2014 results are weighted at 100 per cent whereas, the results in 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 are now weighted at 50 per cent. Therefore, Sri Lanka's strong performances in those two earlier years now count for less.
- In the other major change, the West Indies has slipped two places. This drop has moved Australia and New Zealand up by one place each.

- The world number one now heads to the French Open on solid form after winning the week in Rome after withdrawing from a Madrid semi-final last weekend with a thigh injury.
- Williams becomes the first player on the WTA to lift three trophies this season after beating Italy's Errani for the seventh time with the loss of just one set in that series.

2014 ICC World Team

- His side may have lost in the final but

Mahendra Singh Dhoni was named captain of the 2014 ICC World Team of the Tournament that figures four Indians, including star batsman Virat Kohli.

- Opener Rohit Sharma and Ravichandran Ashwin are the other two Indian players who feature in the team that was announced by the ICC.
- Kohli was adjudged Player of the Tournament for amassing 319 runs with the help of four half centuries, including knocks of 72 and 77 in the semifinal and final of the showpiece event.
- Besides Indians, the team has two players from both South Africa and West Indies, and one representative each from Australia, the Netherlands and champions Sri Lanka.
- Chosen by a select group of experts, the team was aimed at being suited for Bangladesh conditions, on the basis of performances in the tournament only. Statistics were used but were not the sole basis for selections.

The newest Laureus Ambassador

- Spain's young MotoGP world champion Marc Marquez has been appointed the newest Laureus Ambassador.
- Marquez, the youngest ever MotoGP world champion, at 20 years 266 days, a feat for which he received the Laureus World Breakthrough of the Year Award last month, was welcomed into the Laureus Family by motor cycle legend and Laureus World Sports Academy member Mick Doohan.

Match-fixing case

- The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) moved an application before the Supreme Court seeking transcripts of audio tapes containing statements of Board President N Srinivasan and Indian

captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni, recorded by the Mukul Mudgal Committee which probed allegations of IPL spot and match fixing.

- The plea was mentioned before a bench headed by Justice A K Patnaik which posted the matter for hearing on April 11.
- In the application, the BCCI has also sought the transcripts of statements by Sundar Raman, the Chief Operating Officer of IPL.

Wisden's Cricketers of the Year

- Indian batting star Shikhar Dhawan has earned top honours by being named in the prestigious Wisden's list of Five Cricketers of the Year, an honour dating back to 1889, for his 2013 performance.
- The Five Cricketers of the Year are Dhawan, Australia players Chris Rogers and Ryan Harris, England batsman Joe Root and England women's captain Charlotte Edwards.
- Dhawan was acknowledged for his role in India's victorious Champions Trophy campaign in England, in which he was the highest run-scorer, amassing 363 runs in five ODIs at an average of 90.75 and was awarded the Man of the Series for his performance that included centuries against South Africa and West Indies.
- The Cricketer of the Year is chosen by the editor of the Wisden Cricketers' Almanack, based on their 'excellence in, or performance on, the previous English summer' and it can be won only once in a player's career.

Denial of Arjuna Award

- The Supreme Court issued notice to the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports on a petition challenging the withdrawal of the Arjuna Award from a triple jump athlete, Renjith Maheswary,

hours before the presentation ceremony based on a news report that he failed a doping test in 2008.

- A Bench of Chief Justice P. Sathasivam and Justices Ranjan Gogoi and M.Y. Eqbal was acting on a writ petition filed by the Navalokam Samskarika Kendram, Kottayam.
- The petitioner submitted that Mr. Maheswary's name was on the award list released on August 14, 2013. On August 29, he came to Delhi from Chennai and stayed at Hotel Ashoka, along with other award winners. He was presented a cheque for Rs. 5 lakh towards the cash prize the next day and made to participate in a rehearsal at Rashtrapati Bhavan for the function. The next morning, he was told to stay away from the ceremony as the award had been withdrawn.

International Boxing Federation and IABF

- The International Boxing Federation (AIBA) has reportedly terminated any official relationship with its current suspended member, the Indian Amateur Boxing Federation (IABF), for damaging the image, reputation and interest of the sport in the country.
- According to the official AIBA website, AIBA has not recognized any official activities and did not support the officers from IABF since the December 2012 suspension, adding that after receiving disturbing reports on the way the sport of boxing was managed in India, it has now become impossible for them to continue any association with India.
- Boxers and coaches will remain protected and authorized to compete at any competition at all levels under the AIBA flag. AIBA also hopes that the IOA will give its full cooperation until AIBA

approves a new National Federation for the sake of the sport of boxing in India.

Bopanna: 12th in ATP rankings

- India's doubles tennis player Rohan Bopanna leaped four places to 12th in the latest ATP rankings.
- The Indian achieved the feat after clinching the Dubai Duty Free Tennis Championships title with Pakistani Aisam ul Haq Qureshi.
- Meanwhile, Leander Paes still remains India's highest ranked doubles player at No.10 while another veteran Mahesh Bhupathi slipped six places to No.47.
- In the men's singles category, Somdev Devvarman and Yuki Bhambri remained static at 78th and 146th, respectively, while Sania Mirza is No.11 in the women's doubles list.

Cycling academy launched

- Sports minister Jitendra Singh inaugurated the National Cycling Academy at the Indira Gandhi Sports Complex and launched a project to create swimming pools at three separate stadiums in the capital.
- At an estimated cost of '907.50 lakhs, the project of creating swimming pools will come up at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, Indira Gandhi Sports Complex and Karni Singh Shooting Range.
- On the occasion, Singh also launched a Community Connect Scheme to include sports and recreational facilities in the JNS, IGSC and the SP Mukherjee Swimming Complex.
- The academy will be financed by the Union government, and the sports ministry through SAI with a long-term perspective of making it a top notch institution, which is financially independent and a self-sustaining venture.

Vijay Hazare Trophy

- Karnataka annexed a historic triple crown at the Eden Gardens , as the Ranji and Irani Cup champion lifted the STAR Sports Vijay Hazare Trophy for the first time defeating Railways by four wickets in a low-scoring final.
- Karnataka asked Railways to take first strike and restricted the 2005-06 champion to 157 in 47.4 overs with Man-of-the-Match Abhimanyu Mithun picking up four wickets for 19 runs.

Swiss Grand Prix Gold

- Producing yet another emphatic performance, Indian giant slayer P V Sindhu stunned the recently-crowned All England champion Shixian Wang to breeze into the semifinals even as it was end of road for Saina Nehwal at the \$125,000 Swiss Grand Prix Gold .
- In the men's singles, Parupalli Kashyap also booked a semifinal berth with a hard-fought victory over sixth seed Tien Chen Chou of Chinese Taipei.
- Seventh seed Sindhu played a dominating game to assert her supremacy.

- World number 9 Sindhu showed once again why she is considered to be India's next big badminton sensation as she produced a beautifully controlled and carefully-paced game to keep Shixian at bay throughout the quarterfinal match.

1st Asian Grand Prix Archery Championships

- Indian archers won two gold and one silver in team events in the ongoing 1st Asian Grand Prix Archery Championships in Bangkok.
- Compound women team of Gagandeep Kaur, V Jyothi Surekha and P Lily Chanu defeated Iran in the final team event and took the first gold for the country by a good margin of 15 points (219 vs 204). They eliminated Taipei team (224 vs 220) in the semi-final and Lao (224 vs 214) in the quarter-final.
